MOTIONS

9. **Need for the Niger Delta Development Commission (NDDC) to Remobilise to site and complete the Abandoned Obehie–Okeikpe–Akwete–Azumini Road project in the Ukwa West and Ukwa East Local Government Areas of Abia State:**
Hon. Chris Nkwonta

The House:

Notes the efforts of the Niger Delta Development Commission (NDDC) in initiating infrastructural projects across the Niger Delta region, particularly the Obehie-Akwete-Azumini Road Project in the Ukwa West and Ukwa East Local Government Areas of Abia State, which was intended to improve connectivity, commerce and essential service access;

Concerned that the said road project has remained uncompleted and abandoned for an extended period, leaving behind a deteriorated and unsafe stretch of road that has worsened transportation difficulties between the Okeikpe, Akwete and Azumini communities, causing several road accidents, particularly the accident that occurred on Saturday, October 11, 2025, where a trailer rammed into a lock-up shop, destroying goods worth several millions of naira due to the state of the road. Thankfully for God, no life was lost;

Observes that portions of the road project which have already begun to fail before completion indicate poor quality of work and inadequate supervision, which fall short of the expected engineering and developmental standards mandated for NDDC projects;

Worried that the abandonment of the project has subjected the people of Ukwa West and Ukwa East to untold hardship, disrupting local trade and agriculture and limiting access to markets, schools, and healthcare facilities, further entrenching the economic marginalisation of the area;

Aware that NDDC is mandated to ensure proper supervision, quality assurance, and timely completion of all commissioned projects to guarantee value for money and sustainable impact across host communities;

Also aware that the people and local government authorities of Ukwa West and Ukwa East have made several representations to NDDC to address these issues, yet no concrete remedial action has been taken;

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the Management of the Niger Delta Development Commission (NDDC) to remobilise to the site to ensure the completion of the project, conduct a technical audit and independent site inspection

of the said Road Project to assess the quality of work done, determine causes of project stagnation, and recommend corrective measures and ensure strict compliance with approved engineering specifications and the use of standard materials for durable and sustainable road construction;

- (ii) also urge the NDDC to collaborate with the Ukwa West and Ukwa East Local Government Councils in monitoring the continuation of the project to promote transparency, accountability, and community participation;
- (iii) mandate the Committee on Niger Delta Development Commission to investigate the circumstances surrounding the poor quality and abandonment of the Road Project, particularly the Okeikpe-Akwete-Obohia-Azumini axis, and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.

10. Need to Commend the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) on the Recovery of Proceeds of Crime:

Hon. Ginger Onwusibe:

The House:

Notes that the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) was established to address growing public concerns about the destructive impact of economic and financial crimes in Nigeria;

Also notes that despite facing challenges such as politicization, selective prosecution, limited funding, and the complexity of financial crimes, the EFCC has continued to adapt and implement innovative strategies to fulfill its mandate effectively;

Aware that the EFCC has achieved remarkable milestones which includes:

- (a) Securing 4,111 convictions in 2024, the highest number in a single year since its inception;
- (b) Recovering over N364.6 billion, approximately \$214.5 million, and other significant sums in foreign currencies in 2024;
- (c) Successfully gathering and analyzing financial intelligence, disrupting financial crimes like money laundering and terrorist financing, and recovering billions of naira in stolen funds and assets, boosting the national economy and public trust;
- (d) Raising public awareness about financial crimes, emphasizing integrity in public office, and educating citizens on the dangers of corruption;

Recognise the exceptional patriotic efforts demonstrated by the EFCC which increases motivation, boosts morale, and encourages continued excellence;

Resolves to:

formally commend the Chairman, officers, and personnel of the EFCC for their unwavering commitment to combating economic and financial crimes in Nigeria and ensure adequate and timely funding of the EFCC to discharge its mandate effectively.

11. Need to Tackle Gully Erosion in Idah/Igalamela /Ofu Federal Constituency of Kogi State:

Hon. David Idris Zacharias:

The House:

Notes that soil erosion is a major problem in Nigeria, as in many Sub-Saharan African countries, caused primarily by intense rainfall leading to heavy runoff and soil loss;

Also notes that Idah/Igalamela/Odolu and Ofu Federal Constituency in Kogi State continues to face severe challenges from gully erosion, which has become the greatest environmental threat in many parts of the constituency;

Worried that Idah/Igalamela /Ofu Federal Constituency is home to numerous gully erosion sites particularly in Angwa near Ogah Primary School in Idah Ajaka, Igalamela-Odolu Local Government Area and Itobe New Layout, Ajegwu, Aloji, Umomi, and Ugwolawo towns in Ofu Local Government Areas;

Also worried that gully erosion has completely separated the entire Communities, with gullies as deep as 25 meters and as long as 2 kilometers, leading to the loss of roads, agricultural and cultivated lands, as well as the destruction of lives and property thereby making inter-community movement nearly impossible and negatively affecting trade;

Cognizant that with the increase in human development activities and adverse environmental changes, the magnitude of the gully sites in the Federal Constituency will continue to increase, if urgent preventive steps are not taken;

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the Federal Ministry of Environment and the Ecological Fund Office to address the erosion menace in affected Communities in Idah/Igalamela/Odolu and Ofu Federal Constituency of Kogi State;
- (ii) mandate the Committee on Environment to interface with the Federal Ministry of Environment to ensure prompt attention to gully erosion sites in the Federal Constituency, include the project in the 2026 budget estimates, and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.

12. Promoting Sustainable Green Practices in the Three Arms Zone:

Hon. Jesse Okey-Joe Onuakalusi:

The House:

Notes the alarming rate at which trees and green spaces are being indiscriminately felled within the National Assembly Complex and within Three Arms Zone vicinity, under the guise of development, construction and farming;

Also notes that these ongoing construction projects aimed at enhancing infrastructure are being executed without adequate environmental impact assessments or documented plans for reforestation or green replacement measures;

Further notes that a drive out of the National Assembly and the surrounding Three Arms Zone, heaps of firewood are now visibly littered across the area, clearly indicating that the felled trees are being harvested for commercial or domestic use, without any regulatory oversight or consideration for environmental sustainability;

Disturbed that the unchecked removal of trees not only contributes to environmental degradation, heatwaves, soil erosion, and biodiversity loss but also contradicts Nigeria's commitments to climate change mitigation, sustainable development goals (SDGs), and its National Climate Change Policy;

Cognizant that the National Assembly, being a symbol of democratic governance and a beacon of leadership, must lead by example in advancing policies and practices that promote sustainability, environmental protection, and responsible urban development;

Aware that the Honourable Speaker has consistently advocated for climate action, environmental stewardship, and the promotion of green initiatives, and as such, the National Assembly should reflect this vision in words and actions;

Resolves to:

- (i) mandate the Clerk to the National Assembly (CNA) to immediately implement a Tree Replacement Policy, ensuring every tree cut down, at least three indigenous species are planted in designated areas within or around the complex;

- (ii) also mandate the National Assembly Management in collaboration with the Federal Capital Territory Administration (FCTA) to develop and enforce a Green Infrastructure Development Framework that integrates tree preservation, landscaping and ecological protection into all future construction plans in the Three Arms Zone;
- (iii) further mandate the Committees on Environment and Habitat, and FCT to liaise with the Federal Capital Development Authority (FCDA), the Ecological Fund Office, and relevant environmental protection agencies to conduct a thorough audit of all green spaces lost to recent constructions and farming within the zone, establish a Legislative Green Task Force to drive and monitor environmental sustainability efforts within the precincts of the National Assembly;
- (iv) condemn in strong terms the indiscriminate felling of trees and destruction of green areas within the National Assembly and the Three Arms Zone.
