Aware that the Committees are yet to present Reports on the Bills, contrary to the provisions of Order Eighteen, Rule 3 (g) of the Standing Orders of the House of Representatives, to wit:

“(5) any matter referred to a Committee shall be treated within 30 days; otherwise, the Committee shall stand discharged after 60 days except upon a motion for an extension of t time which shall not exceed fifteen days and the matter committed to the Committee of the Whole or any other Committee as the Speaker may decide from time to time.”

Resolves to:

discharge the above-mentioned Committees Bills referred to them and commit same to the Committee of the Whole.

12. Need to Investigate the Over \$1.8 and \$2.8 Billion Grant Received by Nigeria from Global Fund and USAID from 2021 to 2025 for Response Against HIV, Tuberculosis, Malaria, and for Supporting Resilient and Sustainable Systems for Health:

Hon. Amobi Godwin Ogah.

The House:

Notes that the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria, established in 2002, aims to mobilize resources and accelerate global efforts to end these epidemics, particularly in regions like sub-Saharan Africa.

Also notes that Nigeria has received an estimated \$1.8 billion in grants from the Global Fund between 2021 and 2025 to combat HIV, TB, and malaria. Additionally, over \$2.8 million has been received from USAID between 2022 and 2024 to address health challenges such as HIV, malaria, polio, and TB.

Aware that the US President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) contributed over \$6 billion to Nigeria from 2021 to 2025 for combating HIV/AIDS and strengthening health and community systems.

Further notes that the Federal Ministry of Health and Social Welfare oversees USAID grants, while the Country Coordinating Mechanism Nigeria is responsible for implementing the Global Fund grants.

Concerned that despite these significant investments, Nigeria remains burdened by public health threats, including:

- (a) 15,000 AIDS-related deaths among children aged 0-14 in 2023;
- (b) 51,000 AIDS-related deaths in 2023, ranking Nigeria third globally in HIV-related deaths;
- (c) The highest malaria burden globally, with 26.6% of cases and 31% of deaths worldwide;
- (d) Nigeria ranking first in Africa and sixth globally in TB burden, accounting for 4.6% of the global TB burden;

Also aware that the UN Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) sets 2030 as the target for eliminating HIV, TB, and malaria, a goal Nigeria is unlikely to achieve if current trends persist.

Also concerned that there has been no comprehensive and coordinated oversight by the National Assembly regarding the implementation and utilization of these grants.

Worried that without immediate reevaluation and robust oversight, Nigeria risks failing to meet the 2030 elimination target, continuing to bear an enormous disease burden and suffering significant population losses.

Resolves to:

mandate the Committee on HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria Control to investigate the utilization of grants received by Nigeria from 2021 to 2025 for combating HIV, TB, and malaria and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.

13. Need to Tackle Gully Erosion in Idah/Igalamela /Ofu Federal Constituency of Kogi State:
Hon. David Idris Zacharias.

The House:

Notes that soil erosion is a major problem in Nigeria, as in many Sub-Saharan African countries, caused primarily by intense rainfall leading to heavy runoff and soil loss;

Also notes that Idah/Igalamela/Odolu and Ofu Federal Constituency in Kogi State continues to face severe challenges from gully erosion, which has become the greatest environmental threat in many parts of the constituency;

Worried that Idah/Igalamela /Ofu Federal Constituency is home to numerous gully erosion sites particularly in Angwa near Ogah Primary School in Idah Ajaka, Igalamela-Odolu Local Government Area and Itobe New Layout, Ajevwu, Aloji, Umomi, and Ugwolawo towns in Ofu Local Government Areas;

Also worried that gully erosion has completely separated the entire Communities, with gullies as deep as 25 meters and as long as 2 kilometers, leading to the loss of roads, agricultural and cultivated lands, as well as the destruction of lives and property thereby making inter-community movement nearly impossible and negatively affecting trade;

Cognizant that with the increase in human development activities and adverse environmental changes, the magnitude of the gully sites in the Federal Constituency will continue to increase, if urgent preventive steps are not taken;

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the Federal Ministry of Environment and the Ecological Fund Office to address the erosion menace in affected Communities in Idah/Igalamela/Odolu and Ofu Federal Constituency of Kogi State;
- (ii) mandate the Committee on Environment to interface with the Federal Ministry of Environment to ensure prompt attention to gully erosion sites in the Federal Constituency, include the project in the 2026 budget estimates, and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.

14. Call to Provide Details of Federal Government Interventions to States and Local Governments Outside Monthly FAAC Allocations (2023 to Date):

Hon. Abdussamad Dasuki:

The House:

Notes that the Federal Government, in addition to the statutory monthly allocations disbursed through the Federation Account Allocation Committee (FAAC), has continued to provide various forms of financial interventions to States and Local Governments to address fiscal challenges and support development initiatives;

Aware that such interventions include, but are not limited to, budget support facilities, infrastructure funds, ecological and emergency relief grants, and other discretionary or conditional support mechanisms;

Concerned that while these interventions are vital to addressing specific financial and developmental needs at subnational levels, the absence of a consolidated public record of these disbursements may undermine transparency, hinder effective oversight, and limit public accountability;

Worried that without detailed information on the nature, amounts, beneficiaries, and intended purposes of these interventions, it becomes difficult for the legislature to evaluate their effectiveness, monitor utilization, and ensure alignment with national development objectives;

Cognizant of the constitutional responsibility of the National Assembly to conduct oversight over public finance and to promote fiscal transparency and accountability across all levels of government;

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the Minister of Finance and the Governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria to provide to the House, within two (2) weeks, a detailed report of all Federal Government financial interventions, outside FAAC allocations, extended to States and Local Governments from 2023 to date, including the nature of each intervention, amount disbursed, disbursement dates, recipient entities, and conditions (if any) attached;
- (ii) mandate the Committees on Finance, Inter– Governmental Affairs, and Public Accounts to scrutinize the report upon submission and engage relevant stakeholders to ensure transparency, accountability, and value for money, and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.
