## MOTIONS

14. **Need to Investigate the Alleged Use of Harmful Chemicals as Preservatives for Frozen Foods in Nigeria:**  
**Hon. Chike Okafor:**

### **The House:**

*Notes* the alleged use of harmful chemicals as preservatives for frozen foods and other food items in Nigeria, with a view to strengthening food safety regulations in the nation;

*Also notes* that as the representatives of the Nigerian people, it is our duty to ensure that food consumed by citizens is safe, healthy, and free from harmful substances which have caused numerous deaths;

*Aware* of recent reports and allegations on the use of dangerous chemicals, such as formalin, sniper, kerosene, and other harmful preservatives, in frozen foods and other consumable items;

*Worried* that these chemicals are often used to extend the shelf life of food products which can be harmful for consumption, cancerous and damage organs;

*Concerned* that the alleged use of harmful chemicals in food preservation further exacerbates the challenges, as it undermines public trust in the safety of food storage and threatens the health and well-being of millions of Nigerians;

*Alarmed* that Nigeria is already grappling with challenges related to food security, including poor agricultural practices, inadequate storage facilities, and impact of climate change, thus threatening the health and well-being of millions of Nigerians;

*Cognizant* that the National Agency for Food and Drug Administration and Control (NAFDAC), the Standards Organisation of Nigeria (SON) and the Federal Competition and Consumer Protection Commission saddled with the responsibility of ensuring food safety have been alleged to exhibit complicity and negligence, thereby suggesting critical gaps in the enforcement of food safety standards;

*Resolves to:*

mandate the Committees on Nutrition and Food Security, NAFDAC, Healthcare Services, and Safety Standards and Regulations to investigate the alleged use of harmful chemicals as preservatives in frozen foods in Nigeria and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.

15. **Need to Resolve the Backlog and Ease the Issuance of Driver's License:**  
**Hon. Felix Uche Nwaeke:**

### **The House:**

*Notes* the unending backlog in the processing and issuance of Driver's License in the Country;

*Also notes* that an average Nigerian citizen has to wait between three to six months for capturing after applying for a driver's license and almost a year for the Issuance of a Permanent Driver's License;

*Worried* that most Nigerians whose License have expired are subjected to using temporary Driver's License which lasts for only three months and have to pass through the herculean task of renewing same every other three months while waiting on an unending queue for their licenses to be ready;

*Also worried* that if nothing is done to ease the backlog in the issuance of Drivers Licenses in the country, it will continue to be an unending source of stress for the Citizens.

*Resolves to:*

- (i) urge the Federal Roads Safety Commissions (FRSC) and the Vehicle Inspection Office (VIO) to identify the cause of the backlogs and ease same within reasonable timeframe;
- (ii) mandate the Committee on Federal Road Safety Commission to investigate backlog in the processing and issuance of Drivers Licenses in Nigeria and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.
